





This year we had two club captains, both doing the club proud when required. The honour of being Club Captain is in my opinion the highest honour of the club, thanks Toby and Nick.


This season sees a number of our U16s players leaving the club (and as the song goes, thanks for the memories!) good luck with which ever road you young men take, you are always welcome at the club.





#### End Of Year Team Report



From the sidelines this year we were entertained by a great display of skills and team work including :


Guy Baker #7 - Mr Baker, a solid year, comfortable in defence and attack, generous in his off loads with a long range running game.

Lochleigh Thomson #20 - Loch combined strong rucking with ownership of the middle ground and great attacking flare, creating opportunities as the Play On specialist.


James Toon #6 - Playing with courage, Mr T's dedication and commitment to clearance pushed us through some strong defence and took the game to the opposition.



#### **End Of Year Team Report**



#### End Of Year Team Report

2010 was a big season for the U13 Blacks. The team played fantastic football for the whole season, initially winning the Minor Premiership (14-1 win/loss ratio). It was capped off by a committed team performance in the Major Semi Final and Grand Final that saw the boys take out the Premiership.

Many of the boys have been playing footy together for a long time and they have experienced the highs and lows of each season together, going very close on some occasions but just not quite getting there. Nearly all of the boys in the team had experienced the close Grand Final loss in 2008, followed by the disappointment of being knocked out in the Preliminary Final in 2009. This year there was definitely a steely resolve and focus in the team for the finals, especially in the boys who had been there before. They played a superb match against Bankstown in the Major Semi Final. Their attack on the footy and work rate for each other was exceptional. This was capped off by superb finishing skills that resulted in a 9 goal victory (12/4/76 to)3/3/21). However, this time, the Bombers responded each time Ramsgate kicked a goal and the Bombers eventually kicked away late in the match to finish a thrilling and memorable game of footy with a 5 goal victory (9/3/57 to 4/3/27).

You were always committed to get the boys to training and other football events and you always communicated when it was not possible to get the boys there when they had something else on. Again, this year I was amazed at the attendance at training on both the dedicated and optional training nights. Families have so many commitments through the week, so I appreciate the effort in getting the boys to training. The boys' improvement in skills and team play throughout the year was a direct result of that commitment to train well and often.

A special thanks to Todd Sanderson, Assistant Coach. Todd was new to the club at the start of the year but the first thing he said on rego day was "how can I help". Todd was great with the boys in helping them develop their skills and game sense by providing advice to them in all facets of the game. His advice on midfield and ruck contest set up was invaluable. Todd also had running bets with the boys on who could kick goals from tight angles on the boundary prior to training sessions.

Thanks again to Les Mansour for taking on the Manager's job. Like last year, everything he did was a with a smile and he organised a number of team and parent outings for the season that added to the team spirit. If ever Les was away or something was missing his daughter and Assistant Team Manager, Bridgette was there. She was on top of everything and had her dad's smile to go with it!

Many others also helped out. Anne McPherson was always jumping up to help with water or other things such as the much love lollies and chocolates! Ron Maldigri (Trainer and "Runner"). Ron has the ability to deliver a much gentler version of the coach's advice to players when he was the "Runner". Noli Catbagan was ever reliable with the goal umpiring, Tony Hess ("Runner" and Water Carrier), Michael Ryan always offered his help for any job including "Runner", Water Carrier, and goal umpiring. #### #1 Justin Hess


Justin ("Twinnie #1") had a fantastic season. He played mainly on the half back flank where he would read the play well coming towards him and often cut of opponent's attacks. He is very versatile and skillful - able to kick both feet, take strong contested overhead marks. He's one of the best spoilers in the business and he puts his body on the line for the team. This stood out in the Preliminary Final when he launched himself back into a pack for a text book spoil to the boundary line. He also played forward and enjoyed setting up and kicking goals using his keen game sense and skill. Justin's commitment to the contest was also responsible for putting the coach out of action for a couple of months with an ankle sprain. Coach still has not fully recovered!

#### #2 James Ryan

In his first season of footy James was inspirational. A very quiet lad at training and off the field, James would not say much but you could see that he loved his footy and his team. James, usually played in the forward pocket or half forward flank where his ability to find space was highly valued. We would often see James float behind or in front of a pack and take a mark, such was his ability to read the flight of the ball and not be distracted by the movement around him. James was also handy in getting "front and centre" of the packs as he would swoop on the loose footy. Occasionally, James played on the wing and used his paced well to get clear of opponents. A great first season of footy James!

#### #5 Justin Maldigri (Captain)

Justin ("Ding"), selected by his team mates as captain, is renowned for his fierce attack on the footy, pace off the mark and evasive skills. Justin is respected by all opponents as he's rarely beaten to the ball. He has the leap of a Jack Russell terrier, often springing over the back of opponents to take a mark. Justin played most games in the midfield where he combined well with his fellow midfielders to clear the ball from the rucks to the leading forwards. Justin also likes to take on the game by running and bouncing. However, some of his best football this season was his willingness to shepherd for his teammates creating time and space and a path for his team mates to deliver the ball accurately up field.



#### #6 Alex Slater

Alex found his niche in the back pocket this season. We knew the team was playing well when Alex was charging out of defence collecting the loose footy and pumping it down field. Alex also developed the confidence to take on opponents by running and bouncing on a number of occasions. Although relatively slight compared to many of his opponents, Alex would often beat them in the air and take contested marks, preventing opposing teams from kicking goals. Alex also spent some time on the wing and occasionally in the forward pocket but certainly played his best footy down back intercepting the ball as it came down field.

#### **#7 Luke Donnelly (Vice Captain)**

Luke had a very strong season of footy, especially in the second half of the season and he was instrumental to the Bomber's success in the Preliminary and Grand Finals. Luke is one of the team's most skilled players. His ability to kick accurately off both feet on the run to leading targets makes him a dangerous midfielder to all opposing teams. One of his best attributes is his ability to clear the ball effectively around the rucks. It was a common sight to see him sprinting out of a ruck contest breaking tackles and kicking accurately to centre half forward or one of the half forward flankers leading into space. This season Luke has also developed the ability to take overhead contested pack marks which has made him a very versatile footballer.

#### **#8 Elliot Heeney**

After spending much of last year in the ruck, this year, Elliot played a prominent role in the back pocket, a position that he loved to play. Thanks to his Rugby background, Elliot is strong over the footy and is not shy of any contest. We would often see Elliot knocking his opponent off the ball, picking it up and delivering it up to the half back flank or midfield. Elliot has also learnt to kick effectively off both feet which has helped him get the footy away in pressure situations. He can also take a strong mark on the lead. With a bit more work on his kicking technique, especially on the run, some more self belief and confidence, I have no doubt that Elliot could be one of the team's best footballers.

#### **#9 Harley Hill**


Harley's second season of footy was one to remember. Harley was super keen this year. He turned up to preseason training with the U14's and rarely missed an U13's training session during the season. Like last year, Harley found his best football on the wing. Harley loves the open spaces and he has the speed and stamina to run and bounce. We would often see him sprinting down the wing and delivering the ball accurately into the forward line. Harley also spent some time on the half forward flank where his ability to lead and mark the ball overhead served him well. One memorable moment was Harley's left foot (non preferred) kick from deep in the left forward pocket that rolled through for a goal against Ramsgate in Round 3. A feat that would've impressed Lance Franklin!

#### #10 Lachlan Hess

Lachlan ("Twinnie #2") had another fine season of footy. He enjoyed the freedom of playing as a mobile forward after having to take the responsibility of centre half forward for much of last season. When the team was on song we would see Lachlan leading into space behind our centre half forward and out mark his opponent. Lachlan has a deadly kick and can kick off both feet. During the season, he potted goals from all angles in the air and along the ground. Lachlan had a purple patch in Round 3 when he kicked 5 goals against Ramsgate. One of these was from an acute angle where he grabbed the ball from a boundary throw-in deep in the forward pocket slotted it through. Lachlan sometimes swapped with his brother to play off the half back flank where his reading of the play to intercept the footy coming down the ground helped the team to rebound effectively up the ground.

#### #12 Max Simmer

Max ("Wiggle") was a key team contributor in his 2<sup>nd</sup> year of footy. It all culminated in a superb performance on Grand Final day. Max was inspirational and dominated his position on the half back flank, out marking his opponent on many occasions. However, it was his willingness to chase, tackle and pressure, not only his direct opponent, but anyone loose in the forward line that had the ball, that helped the team perform so well. He won most one on one contests and was one of the best players on the ground that day. Throughout the season Max sometimes played in the midfield and his fierce attack on the footy meant that the Bombers would usually win the ball. Max's kicking technique improved out of sight towards the end of the year, so we expect to seem him go to another level next year with his improved skills.



#### **#13 Matthew McPherson**

Matthew ("Matty") became one of the team's best players this season. He was "Mr Versatile" and played in a number of positions thanks to his ability to mark the footy, speed, run and bounce and tackle. He mostly played on the half forward flank where he would charge up the ground on the lead, demanding the footy. Often the ball would be delivered deeper in the forward line but that wouldn't worry Matt because he was happy to draw an opponent out and create space for his teammates deeper in the forward line. When the ball was kicked to Matt we would often see him take some fine contested marks. If he didn't win the ball he would chase and tackle. Matt also played on the wing and off the half back flank where he also played well. Unfortunately, Matt broke his hand playing basketball before the Grand Final but he did get on the ground for the last minute or so of the match to celebrate with the boys. A fine season of footy Matt!

#### #15 Dylan Sanderson (Vice Captain)

Watching Dylan play, you wouldn't think it was his first season of footy. He started off a as a very good player in his first game and finished off the season as the best U13's key position player in the region. Certainly he's the best centre half forward in U13's competition. If anyone can remember John Longmire playing for North Melbourne, well this is what Dylan is like. Strong on the ground and in the air and he out competes anyone. The ball just sticks to those strong hands. Dylan was outstanding in the Preliminary and Grand Finals, as he dominated his opponents, taking a number of overhead contested marks and finishing off with goals, sometimes from 30-40m out. Throughout the season, Dylan also spent time in the ruck and at centre half back, where he also played well. He proved to be a quality ruckman as his 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> efforts were always there, meaning that he accumulated possessions and was able to kick the ball into the forwards on a number of occasions.

#### #17 Ryan Catbagan


Ryan ("Rhino") had another strong season. He played a vital role in the Bombers strong midfield. Ryan's role was to get in low and get the footy out when there were numbers around the ball. Ryan is very hard to tackle and he would often take on opponents and they would just slip off him. It was a common sight to see Ryan streaming out of the centre square, stepping through opponents and delivering the ball to a leading forward. Ryan's fitness improved during the season allowing him to get to more contests in the midfield and run to space when the opposition turned the ball over. Ryan often out marks taller opponents thanks to his ability to position himself well, read the flight of the ball and take the ball overhead using his strong hands.

#### #18 Ethan Turney

Ethan's ("Ethos") 2<sup>nd</sup> season of footy was a memorable one. Ethan would usually play at full forward or in the forward pocket. Ethan would play to his strengths. He has the ability to gather the footy and quickly turn either way to kick off either foot. Ethan is also a strong chest mark and he uses his body well to stop opponents getting the prime position in a marking contest. Capped of with his ability to kick accurately on the run, Ethan finished off a number of Bomber attacks with goals. Occasionally Ethan played on the wing or in the backs and adapted well. Some more time in the backs next season will help him round out his fast development in AFL.

#### #19 Tom Logan

Tom ("T-Lo") is the team's 3<sup>rd</sup> first year player. Tom's height and ability to run all day suited him perfectly to the ruck position. Tom was rarely beaten in ruck contests and usually gave the Bomber's midfield first use of the ball. Once he developed the art of gently tapping the ball to either side to his running midfielders, the Bombers became the clearance specialists and it served the team well in many games including the Preliminary Final and the Grand Final. Tom also has speed to burn and he would often run down and tackle opponents of any size. Combine all this with a huge kick, and Tom was a headache for any opposition. Tom also played at centre half forward and centre half back on occasions where he often beat his direct opponent especially in the air. A top line 1<sup>st</sup> season of footy Tom!



#### #21 Vaughan Barnes

Vaughan continued to develop his football skills this year. He mostly played on the half forward flank. His strong leading up the ground and long and powerful kicking was a feature of the Bomber's play. He's a bit like Stuart Dew, driving the ball long and flat like a bullet towards goal or to a leading teammate. Vaughan played a memorable role in the Grand Final, a game that he and the team will never forget. Vaughan's work ethic by making sacrificial leads up the ground helped the team by opening up space for the forwards playing deeper in attack. However, he was still directly rewarded on many occasions for his efforts as he took a number of fine contested marks. One of these marks, combined with a fine kick for goal, was the sealer for the team in the Grand Final that saw him mobbed by his teammates.

#### #20 Mitch Johnson

Mitch was the team's "rock" in defence at centre half back and was instrumental to the team's success all year. Mitch would usually beat his opponent in the air and when his confidence was up, he would run off opponents and create havoc across the half back line by setting up counter attacks that often led to goals for the Bombers. Mitch has strong hands and it was a common sight to see him pluck the ball overhead in a pack of players. He also has blistering pace and a great ability to pick up the ball up cleanly off the ground. This combined with an accurate and penetrating drop punt makes him a complete footballer. Mitch occasionally played in the ruck and at centre half forward where he used his height speed and marking ability to great effect.

#### #22 Marcus Mansour

Marcus usually played at full back. He played the position to perfection as he would out body his opponent in one on one contests and either mark the footy or spoil the ball to ground and then quickly recover and see the footy out of danger. He also developed the ability of knowing when it was best to leave his direct opponent and go for the footy and back himself to get it before an opponent and then clear the footy effectively up the ground. Marcus also regularly played at full forward and his strong and well timed leads up the ground were a feature of the Bomber's play. His ability to kick accurately for goal from set shots is also a fine feature of his game. Marcus has developed the ability to take strong overhead marks which has helped him take his game to a new level this season.

#### Harry Beardsley



Ben was put into the ruck rover's role and his ability to win the ball in the tight contests and quickly handball off to running teammates, played a crucial role in the Bomber's win that day. He also played a prominent role in the Preliminary and Grand Finals. Ben trained with the team on Tuesdays and with his U12's team on Thursdays for the whole season, a very dedicated club and team player.

#### Nathan Walsh

Nathan played 6 matches for the U13 Blacks including the Preliminary Final. Nathan played on the wing, half back flank and back pocket. His speed and skill was a welcome addition to the team. 

#### Aaron Hooker



#### Liam Cashman



#### <u>Toby Bishop</u>



#### End Of Year Team Report


